





A Seed Planted, A Forest Grown: The Legacy of Paul Penjaska



In 2003, Paul Penjaska planted a seed at the Shiawassee Community Foundation, a seed that has since grown into a thriving forest of opportunities for local students. Paul Penjaska, a skilled machinist and owner of Penjaska Tool, left a substantial bequest to the Foundation with a vision to inspire and support future inventors and innovators in his community.

Mr. Penjaska's passion for invention and engineering was evident in every corner of his home. His dining room and kitchen tables were adorned with calculators, protractors, a compass, and pages filled with handwritten calculations and geometric drawings. Upstairs, mathematical books and blueprints were stacked like novels, reflecting his lifelong dedication to engineering and invention, despite having no formal education beyond high school.

The Paul Penjaska Family Scholarship Fund, created from his generous estate gift of \$440,000, has grown to \$643,642 and has awarded 209 scholarships totaling \$407,277. These scholarships have supported students pursuing a wide range of disciplines including welding, engineering, education, healthcare, business, technology, biochemistry, finance, aviation, meteorology, animal science, physics, criminal justice, automotive, and environmental science.

Paul Penjaska's legacy continues to make a significant impact on Shiawassee County. His vision and generosity have opened doors for students to attend college, trade schools, workshops, and more, with a primary focus on the trades, physical sciences, and engineering. His story is a testament to the lasting difference one person can make in their community.
